ORPHEUS|PDX ANNOUNCES PARTICIPANTS OF NEW PATHWAYS PROGRAM

OrpheusPDX's innovative training program utilizes the new 2023 season and its professional staff to assist others in establishing new careers and, in the process, help guarantee a thriving future for the operatic art form.

(Portland, Oregon) — OrpheusPDX General and Artistic Director Christopher Mattaliano knows well the challenges involved in starting an opera career. "Like any other field," he says, "getting your foot in the door, getting those first few connections can often be the most difficult steps. I recognize how fortunate I was to work under the guidance of major artists early in my career, and I'm committed to providing those kinds of connections and experiences for the next generation. That's what our new Pathways Program is all about."

Mattaliano is well known for teaching gifted young opera singers at Juilliard, Yale, Princeton, and at the Metropolitan Opera's Lindemann Young Artist Development Program. This new mentor-based program pairs a student or young professional with an established professional who has been engaged by OrpheusPDX for its 2023 productions. The five participants in the program include both performers and designers. They will spend the season assisting their mentor and be intimately involved in all aspects of their line of work.

Luke D'Silva, a high school violist selected for the program though audition, said "I am looking forward to being mentored by professional violists. I hope to learn how to improve techniques and to be more attuned to other musicians. Also, it will be a great experience to be part of an opera orchestra. I am really interested in pursuing a double major in engineering and music in college. The Pathways Program will be a great program to prepare me for this plan."

"The participants in this program dive in and learn on their feet" Mattaliano added. "They're actively involved in the on-going creative planning and rehearsal process—observing, questioning, actively participating, being allowed to make mistakes and learn from them—all under the guidance of an established professional mentor. There's no better learning experience."
